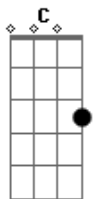

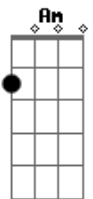
C

Let the memory live again

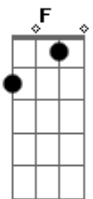

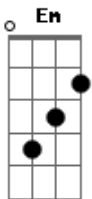

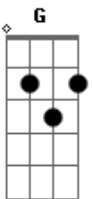
