Go back strumming  $\operatorname{Em}$  barre fast here then comes  $\operatorname{Am}$  barre fast and a  $\operatorname{C}$  barre chord is slided up to 3 - 4 times, then follows

Here's another part with chords B7 - C - F7M - D - G - B7 - Em strummed fast.

After the solo repeat verse 1 and follow up with the strumming part above.
