Listening to Bob Dylan singin' in 1963,

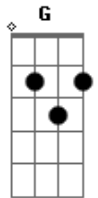
watching the flags of freedom flyin'.

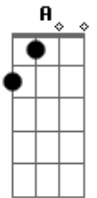

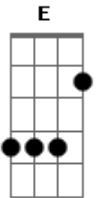
