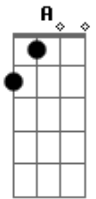

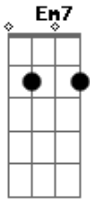
NOTATION USED:

- steady slide means use a bottle neck!

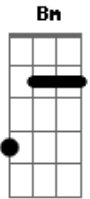
